- Participates in the formulation and implementation of Team product line, operations, and strategic planning initiatives.
- Promotes ATN within professional, civic, technical, and industrial organizations and other agencies.
- Collaborates, cooperates, promotes, and communicates with employees of the host college.
- Utilizes Enterprise Planning Resources (ERP) system, NetSuite, to record time, expense, and other data in a timely manner.
