### **ABC Silica Workshop Event**



#### Workshop 2024 - Silica: Hazards and Controls

ABC, UA Safe State, and Alabama Chapter ASSP partnered to hold a half day workshop on Silica: Hazards and Controls that focused on silica exposures to construction workers. OSHA established a Silica Standard for the Construction Industry. It developed tables that provided guidance for engineering controls and employee protection during construction activities. If you followed the table requirements for these activities engineering and worker p0rotection requirements were provided.

Mr. Randy Easterling, UA Safe State H&S Supervisor, presented on silica hazards and controls. Approximately 30 participants form Alabama, Georgia, Mississippi, and Tennessee listened to the presentation. It provided an understanding of what OSHA expects construction contractors to do while performing activities listed in the tables. The presentation discussed engineering controls including issues with using water and respiratory protection issues. A demonstration of the air sampling requirements was also performed by Mr. Matt Sprague, UA Safe State Health Consultant. This demonstration showed how the sampling should be setup and calibrated as well as possible issues during calibration.

Thanks to ABC for the use of their facility for this event and providing breakfast for the attendees and presenters. The next ABC, UA Safe State, and Alabama Chapter ASSP workshop event will be Electrical Issues in Construction presented by Dr. David Carpenter, Integrity Institute. This event will be on November 8, 2024 and is also a half-day workshop. Registration will be available soon through ABC, <a href="mailto:monica@abc-alabama.org">monica@abc-alabama.org</a>.
